

TRAINEESHIP TRAINING FEES POLICY 2022



Traineeship training fees are invoiced after signing of the Training Contract

The Student tuition fees are indicative only and are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. Additional fees may apply such as student service and resource fees.

Hospitality Group Training is required by the State Government's VET Fees and Charges Policy 2022 to charge the following Fees:

\$3.25 per Nominal Hour of Training

(Concession Student Fees are charged at \$0.97 per Nominal Hour – eligibility conditions apply – see below)

* From 1 January 2020, under the new "lower fees, local skills" program trainees pay only half of the standard course fees for a number of specially selected qualifications. And for these selected qualifications, the course fees will be capped per year so that the maximum course fees paid will be only \$1,200 or \$400 if aged 15—24 or are eligible for a concession.

Please note the State Government's VET Fees and Charges Policy is released in January of each year and is subject to change. As such any Units of Competency not commenced prior to 1 January 2023 will be subject to 2022 fees and may require a "gap fee" to be charged.

HGT provides a 10 day cooling off period that will apply if a trainee wishes to withdraw from a course, once confirmation and payment has been processed. If a participant wishes to withdraw within the cooling off period they must notify HGT in writing and return all HGT course materials in their original state within 5 working days from the course withdrawal notification. On receipt of all course materials HGT will refund any payment received, in full.

Should the trainee formally withdraw from the traineeship within three (3) months of commencement the employer may be entitled to a pro rata refund based on training not yet commenced.

NB: Concession Rate student eligibility

- Persons and dependants of persons holding a:
 - Health Care Card
 - Pensioner Concession Card
 - Repatriation Health Benefits Card
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of AUSTUDY or ABSTUDY
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of Youth Allowance
- Secondary school aged person – means a person who has reached 15 years of age but has not reached the end of the calendar year in which their compulsory education period expires, as defined in the School Education Act 1999. In 2019 these persons will be born on or after 1 July 2001.

NB: Exemptions

School Based Trainees are exempt from all training fees
